The reports contained within are a companion to the annual EDIE Report produced by Apprise Health Insights for the Oregon Health Leadership Council. Please refer to that report for more detail on some of the metrics used in these dashboards (e.g. High Utilizers, Joiners, Leavers, Stayers, etc.).

These reports combine two sources of data: real-time emergency department data from Collective Medical Technologies (EDIE) with more detailed emergency department discharge data from Apprise Health Insights (INFOH).

A "High Utilizer" is defined as a patient who seeks medical attention specifically at an emergency department five or more times a year.

Quick Facts


- The total number of ED visits fell by 1.4%
- The number of High Utilizer visits **fell by 5.2%**
- Co-morbid Mental Health related visits increased by 1.4%
- Co-morbid Substance Use Disorder related visits decreased by 4%
- Potentially Avoidable visits from High Utilizers decreased by 11.2%
- Visits decreased by 31% in the 90 days following an initial care guideline





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
Q1 2018 - Q4 2018 EDIE DASHBOARD UTILIZATION AND MOVEMENT








HIGH UTILIZER COMORBIDITY, MENTAL HEALTH, AND SUBSTANCE USE DISORDER
